### 1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

Jim welcomed all to the meeting.

#### 2. LOCKDOWN REVIEW

Natalie provided a brief update. Agreed to share info on areas identified by improvement service likely to be most significantly impacted by Covid-19, currently the focus of targeted leafleting with support line info.

#### 3. SOCIAL DISTANCING

Spaces for People bid submitted by DCC to Scottish Government, proposals available online. Hoped that further bids will be made for future phases.

Suggested one way system for pedestrian traffic along busy, narrow footways including Perth Road. Fraser has raised such possibilities with Robin Presswood and John Berry of City Development,

### 4. USE OF PUBLIC SPACE

Concern raised about car on Magdalen Green recently.

Fly tipping an ongoing concern, hoped that reopening of civic amenity sites is imminent.

Aware of backlog of grass cutting and catch up required.

Some concern about increased incidence of graffiti, noted at sub-station Magdalen Green and along Riverside. Head of Environment Services, Tony Boyle has confirmed that the graffiti removal team is stood down currently but that response to graffiti of an offensive nature will be immediate.

Suggested longer term solution to problematic tag type graffiti at sites such as the sub-station on Magdalen Green is a permanent artwork. Russell suggested a specific artist known for his "environmental" themed art and it was agreed that Russell should speak to the artist re cost/possible proposal and that Fraser would share contact at SSE re approvals.
